



Dangerous Health Issues Related to Vaping

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has issued an alert about an increase in vaping-associated lung injury. CDPH has identified 80 cases of acute lung disease in California among people with a recent history of vaping cannabis or nicotine. All patients have required hospitalization, with some needing breathing support. Deaths have also been associated with the disease. For more information visit <http://bit.ly/cdc-vape>
