I. Introduction

Many sections of your profile can be edited or added/removed including a photo, research overview, publications, grants, websites, video lectures, faculty mentoring and more.

Demographic information can only be changed through the <u>UC Path</u> (Edit My Record) or HR.

Just under the main menu, click the <u>Login</u> link and select UC **Davis** to sign in using your Kerberos credentials.

After logging in, youâ \in^{TM} ll see a sub-menu with your name and more options. You may designate a proxy to edit your profile for you by clicking the Manage Proxies link in the edit menu, then clicking â \in Add A Proxyâ \in on that page. Search for and add the person you want to be able to make edits on your behalf. Click Edit My Profile if the system did not already take you to your edit page when you logged in.





3. Publications

UC Davis Profiles will automatically match and suggest publications from PubMed for each profile page. Due to ambiguity around more common names, multiple names or former institutional affiliations, some publications may be missed, or mis-matched. These auto-suggestions can also be removed by Profiles in the future. Therefore, it is very important that you

sign in to Confirm or Delete publications that Profiles suggested. You can search and add PubMed publications from within this edit screen. Or you can get a list of PubMed IDs from PubMed and paste them in here. Publications may also be added manually.



Curating your publications has the added benefit of helping Profiles do a better job finding your PubMed publications in the future.


