

NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Ophthalmologists must constantly update their practice by incorporating new evidence-based therapies, surgical techniques and scientific insights. Results of needs assessments indicate an educational need for a succinct update on the latest developments in ophthalmology from experts in the field utilizing didactic instruction, video presentations, panel discussions and interactive roundtable sessions.
