Applications are now being accepted for Fall 2023 Cohort of the R01 Application Program

The R01 Application Program (RAP) is a cohort style mentorship program that provides new investigators with a solid foundation in creating, submitting, and receiving their first R01 grant from the National Institutes of Health (NIH). This year the program will be a 2-part series. Part 1 is a three-month commitment, October - December. Attendance to all lectures and mentoring sessions are required. The Candidate must have at least one faculty mentor who is willing to provide support and attend one mentoring session during the program.

- Study design
- Specific Aims Page

Part 2 will start in early 2024 and focus on writing a fully developed R01. Participation will require a separate evaluation process.
