#### Preclinical/Basic Science Curriculum

John Doe has successfully completed the preclinical/basic science curriculum which is graded pass-fail.

#### AREAS OF SCHOLARLY CONCENTRATION

UC Davis SOM students can choose to customize their education in one of five Areas of Scholarly Concentrations: Global/One Health Practice, Healthcare Advocacy and Policy, Medical Education, Quality Improvement and Patient Safety, and Research. The Areas of Scholarly Concentration allow students to participate in curriculum, mentorship, and scholarship under the guidance of a faculty mentor. Students who complete the M1-M3 three-year curriculum earn a Certificate of Distinction. Students can also complete a 2- or 4-week capstone in the M4 post-clerkship phase.

#### **ASC: Medical Education**

Medical Student John Doe received a Certificate of Distinction in ASC: Medical Education having participated in both in-person activities and self-paced asynchronous modules totaling more than 40 hours of robust longitudinal content outside of required classroom learning and patient care responsibilities. Under the guidance of a faculty mentor who supports deeper understanding and application of related topics, this student is well prepared for continued contributions in the field.

In addition, Medical Student John Doe will complete a 4 - week capstone in the M4 post-clerkship phase.

## **ASC: Medical Education Mentor Summary**

Medical Student John Doe earned a Certificate of Distinction in the Medical Education Area of Scholarly Concentration. Above and beyond the required pre-clerkship curriculum and clinical duties, John deeply engaged with topics on the science of effective learning and teaching while completing self-paced asynchronous modules and participating in in-person workshops, totaling more than 40 hours of robust content. Under the guidance of the Medical Education faculty mentor, John built a solid foundation of knowledge and is well prepared to make valuable, continued contributions to the field. Indeed, John will apply his understanding to a 4-week (80-120 hours) Curriculum Design Capstone Project during the post-clerkship phase. His project is entitled "Integrating Interactive Information: A Multimodal Approach to Team-Based Learning". The capstone project builds on his growing understanding of effective medical education, specifically as it relates to curriculum development, learner engagement, educational technology, activating prior knowledge, primacy/recency, chunking, team-based

learning, and active learning methods for pre-clerkship instruction. His project is well underway and we look forward to his final capstone project presentation at the Area of Scholarly Concentration Symposium in March 2025.

## Clerkships (in chronological order)

PSY 430 Psychiatry Clerkship 2023-24 (May - June 2023) Grade: Pass

Overall grade based on Clinical: 70%, Shelf Exam: 20%, Professionalism: 10%

Student Dr. John Doe gave an outstanding performance on the psychiatry clerkship. He impressed his site directors and clinical preceptors on both of his sites (outpatient psychiatry [APSS] and C-L psychiatry [UCD]. John is hard working, bright, and thoughtful when caring for patients. Dr. Christina Lee and team noted: "John was a great asset to consultation liaison psychiatry service. He was responsible for initial assessments, data gathering, ascertainment of laboratory and neuroimaging results, initial treatment planning, and follow-up/disposition. He worked well with the multidisciplinary team, was thoughtful, reflective, and inquisitive. He gave concise oral presentations and documented in a timely manner. He was able to quickly build good rapport with patients." At the APSS site, Dr. Koike noted: "John is an outstanding medical student! I was so impressed with his performance, especially because it was his very first rotation. He is a skilled interviews. His notes are well written. He has a thirst for knowledge, and is responsive to feedback." Excellent work student Dr. Doe!

FAP 430 Family Medicine Clerkship 2023-24 (June - July 2023) Grade: Pass

Overall grade based on Clinical: 70%, Shelf Exam: 20%, Professionalism: 10%

John Doe rotated at the UC Davis midtown primary care office during his third year family medicine rotation. His clinical performance was excellent, earning the following praise from his site director, "John Doe brought an enthusiastic attitude and desire to learn to his rotation. His questions were well thought out, and appropriate. We all noticed that he was good at establishing rapport with patients and had a great bedside manner. He did a good job counseling patients and providing education, and being sure they understood the care plan. He was above his level when it comes to formulation of care plans, and differentials. Was comfortable helping, and doing minor procedures including knee injection, I and D of an abscess and cryotherapy. He will do well in whatever specialty he chooses." John demonstrated proficiency in all of the expected clerkship competency domains. He completed the other clerkship requirements including completion of a 40-hour case-based online family medicine curriculum, a presentation to his peers on the unique features of his clinical site from a health care systems science perspective, a thoughtful narrative reflection on being able to engage the most human aspects of medicine working in a primary care setting, and an excellent performance on the final shelf exam.

OBG 430 Obstetrics and Gynecology Clerkship 2023-24 (August - September 2023) Grade: Pass

Overall grade based on Clinical: 50%, Shelf Exam: 20%, Practical Exam: 20%, Professionalism: 10%

John Doe passed the ob/gyn clerkship via successful composite average of the clinical evaluations, the practical exam, and NMBE shelf exam. He was noted for his overall excellence. One evaluator stated, "It is rare for the presence of a medical student to reduce the amount of work for a team, but John's presence with me on labor and delivery as well as gyn oncology showed his adaptability and work ethic. I found myself relying on John to manage his patients with a level of independence well beyond his degree of training." For example, he "placed a neurology consult we needed for a patient, followed up with neurology, gave the team a thorough but succinct summary of their recs, pended the tests they recommended, and followed up on the results of all those tests with the team ensuring that he did not interrupt our workflow." His "bedside manner puts patients at ease." He"consistently obtained a problem focused history that was concise and thorough, and then was able to present in a logical manner. He always offered, without prompting, an initial differential diagnosis and plan of management that was reasonable." He responded to feedback promptly. "John is attentive to patient needs and had good situational awareness" making him "the type of teammate you want to have at 2 am."

SUR 430 Surgery Clerkship 2023-24 (October - November 2023) Grade: Pass

Overall grade based on Clinical: 65%, Shelf Exam: 25%, Professionalism: 10%

John did a great job on the surgery clerkship, exceeded expectations on many of the competencies, and received many accolades from those who he worked with. He demonstrated an eagerness to participate in all patient care activities and a willingness to learn. He displayed a strong knowledge base, strong information gathering and physical examination skills, and provided excellent differential diagnosis. His critical thinking skill was also judged to be great. He also excelled as a team member, worked hard to help his team, and created a very positive environment for himself and his peers. His interactions with patients and their families were aways professional and with compassion. Overall, an excellent performance in the surgery clerkship.

IMD 430 Internal Medicine Clerkship 2023-24 (November - January 2024) Grade: Pass

Overall grade based on Clinical: 60%, Game Changers Exam: 15%, Shelf Exam: 15%, Professionalism: 10%

John was an excellent student who was eager to learn and was always seeking learning opportunities. He had extremely polished, concise, and thoughtful oral presentations which clearly demonstrated advanced clinical reasoning. He was incredibly thoughtful and kind at the

bedside, with a warm demeanor that put patients at ease. His history and physical exams were always hypothesis driven and demonstrated that he was formulating appropriate differential diagnoses on the fly. He was dedicated to his patients, never missing an opportunity to provide patient education or help address their social determinants. His medical knowledge was deep, and he applied it appropriately and accurately.

## PED 430 Pediatrics Clerkship 2023-24 (January - March 2024) Grade: Pass

Overall grade based on Clinical: 55%, Shelf Exam: 15%, OSCE: 20%, Professionalism: 10%

Student doctor **Doe** performed exceptionally well in the Pediatrics clerkship. He excelled in the OSCE and clinically as noted by his preceptors: "Overall, {John] functioned at intern level as MS3, formulated differentials, and what stood out is that based on differentials [he] established a CONFIDENT, and reasonable plan with associated lab and/or medications, as needed." His "notes stood out as better than some of our current residents." "He showed extraordinary compassion which was evident through his care." "He gave excellent, thorough presentations with pertinent information on rounds." "His presentations were notable for his ability to capture pertinent exam findings, labs and imaging results while omitting irrelevant details."
