

This week, meet Dr. Kristin Hoffman:

<u>Telemedicine connecting babies to families.</u>

One of the challenges for families with a baby in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU,) is that hospitalizations can be very long and many families are unable to be at the bedside as much as they would like as they return to work and care for other children. UC Davis serves a vast geographic area and families often travel long distances to visit their baby in the NICU. In 2014, the Children's Miracle Network awarded a grant to Drs. Kristin Hoffman and Aaron Bair to develop a system for parents to view their infants remotely when they were unable to be in the NICU. The grant also included funding to develop

simulation training and mock codes for residents, fellows, nursing staff, and respiratory therapists and to develop a series of 4 videos to demonstrate proper care for infants with special needs: gastrostomy feeding tubes, cleft palate, ileostomy, and tracheostomy.

Dr. Hoffman and George Wu from the Center for Health and Technology evaluated commercially available products for families to view their infant from remote locations but these were prohibitively expensive, required high bandwidth and technical support, and did not quite satisfy the unique needs of our NICU. The CHT team therefore developed our own telemedicine solution through Jabber Guest using webcams and a flexible tripod to mount the cameras on each type of infant isolette, warmer, or crib. Families may now see their infants 24 hours a day through a secure connection from a home computer, tablet, or phone. Use of the "virtual visit" through this UC Baby Program has expanded to 31 of the 49 beds in the NICU. Family enrollment in the program is assisted through the efforts of our wonderful NICU nurses and our Child Life and Social Work teams. Feedback from families has been very positive, particularly for those whose infants have been in the NICU for prolonged stays or who live long distances from the hospital.

- You will be asked to upload a brief letter of support from your Department Chair or Dean (if you are a professor or researcher,) or from your faculty advisor (if you are a post-doctoral scholar.)
