

2. The best-kept secrets to winning grants - with competition for research funding, experts reveal their top tips and tricks. Competition for funding is ruthless, and the stakes are particularly high at the NIH – the largest single source of funding for biomedical research in the world. The Agency's research-project grants - R01s and other, similar grants - are the main mechanism for funding investigator initiated biomedical research in the United States, supporting about 27,500 investigators at any given time. The five year average success rate is about 18% of the applicant pool, a historic low that shows little sign of moving. As a result, grant reviewers resort to finding any flaw they can to weed out applications which creates a daunting challenge for those who don't yet know the ropes.

An article was recently published by Nature the International weekly journal of science, which provides grant guidance for those in need of tips and experience writing the perfect grant.
