2. ENSURING COMPLIANCE: INTERNATIONAL RELATIONSHIPS AND ACTIVITIES AT UC DAVIS

Commitment to Nondiscrimination

The UC non-discrimination policy states that the university does not discriminate and prohibits discrimination based on a protected classification, and generally does not accept sponsors' restrictions of research based on citizenship. Fur-ther, UC Davis remains committed to continuing and building important and successful relationships and collaborations with our foreign colleagues and Institutions.

However, recently, the U.S. government has identified threats to our national security in the form of intellectual prop-erty diversion by foreign actors. Specifically, the academic freedom and open exchange of ideas that is essential to the mission of the university also creates a unique set of risks. Thus, it is important that all UC Davis personnel protect the integrity of our resources through consistent disclosure and reporting of international research, scholarly, and outside activities through all appropriate channels.

Steps You to Must Take to Ensure Compliance Research Sponsor/Grant Disclosure Requirements

Several government agencies have recently released new/updated information and guidance about disclosure and re-porting of international relationships as part of the contracts and grants submission process. Disclose to your sponsor if:

- You have or may receive research support from anyone else for any of your other research endeavors/projects, regardless of whether these other projects relate to the research you are conducting for these spon-sors (e.g. "current and pending" or "other" support);
- 2) you or any of your research personnel perform on the project outside of the United States (e.g. "foreign com-ponent"); or
- 3) any foreign entity is supporting or making payments to any foreign scholars and students who are key person-nel related to your project (e.g. "foreign affiliation").

Please check the <u>Office of Research website</u> for updated guidance, sponsor-specific policies, definitions, and FAQs, es-pecially if you are sponsored by the **NIH**, **NSF**, **DoD**, **or DoE**.

Financial Conflict of Interest (COI) Disclosure Requirements in Research

State and federal law and/or UC Davis policy require researchers to disclose to the institution certain outside financial interests and, if necessary, manage potential conflicts of interest through a COI Committee-recommended manage-ment plan. Ensure that all such federal- and state-mandated financial conflict of interest (COI) disclosures are made in a timely fashion. (e.g. outside consulting, honoraria, appointment at other academic institutions above monetary thresholds, etc.)

Conflict of Commitment (COC) Disclosure Requirements ("Outside Activity Reporting")

In addition to mandatory COI reporting, you must disclose all your outside professional activities, whether paid or un-paid, through UC Davis Outside Activities Reporting System (OATS). Please note that many of these activities require pre-approval (e.g. company startups, employment or professorships outside of the university, performing research on behalf of or at another organization, etc.).

Export Control Compliance Requirements

Contact the <u>UC Davis Export Control Officer</u> to determine if your activity is permitted and/or requires a license (e.g. sharing controlled technology with foreign persons overseas or in your lab, international research collaborations, trav-eling or shipping research materials overseas). INFORMATION FOR FACULTY WITH FEDERALLY SPONSORED RESEARCH AND INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS

UC Davis highly values and encourages international collaborations and engagement as evidenced by our Global Affairs programs and support of our international students and faculty.
