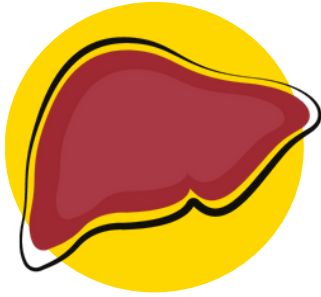
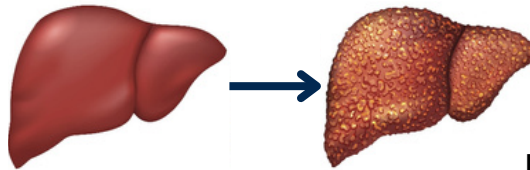


Hepatitis B Screening:

Hepatitis B is a vaccine-preventable liver infection caused by the Hepatitis B virus (HBV).

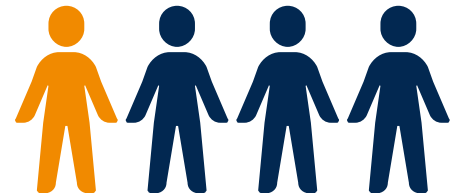


HBV is the leading cause of **liver cancer** in Asians Americans and Pacific Islanders.

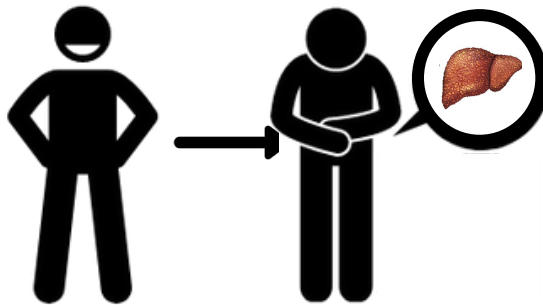
Without treatment...

1 in 4

people with HBV develop serious liver problems



The CDC suggests that all adults aged 18 and above should get tested for HBV. This includes people who have never been screened for HBV and those who don't have a long-term HBV diagnosis.

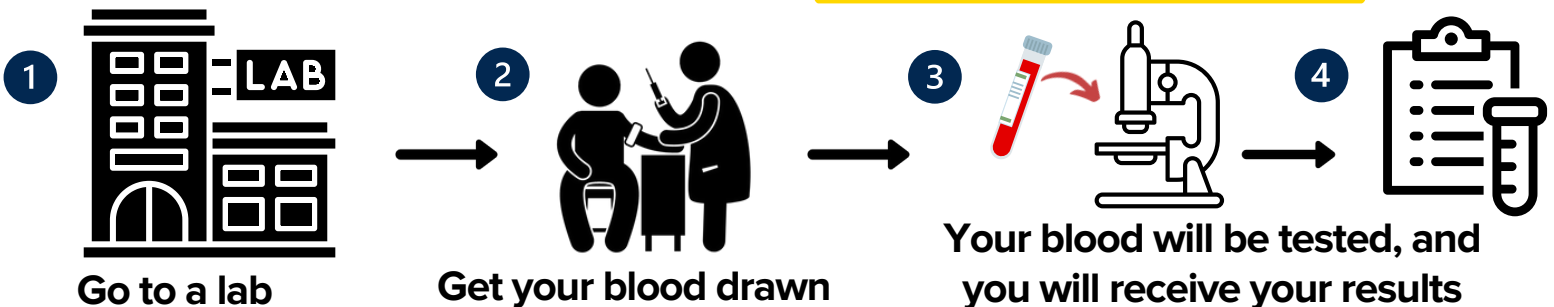


Many people have **NO SYMPTOMS** but damage to the liver can still occur.
