Lung cancer is a disease in which cancer cells form in the tissue of the lung. There are two main types: Non-Small Cell Lung Cancer (NSCLC) and Small Cell Lung Cancer (SLC).

LUNG CANCER SCREENING Talk to your doctor if screening is right for you!

- An annual Low-Dose CT Scan is recommended for people who are at high risk.
- You would be considered high risk if you meet all of the following criteria:
 - Are 50 to 80 years old
 - Are currently smoking or have quit within the last 15 years
 - Have a smoking history of ≥20 pack-years (e.g., 1 pack per day x 20 years)
