Understanding Atypical Brain Development: Insights from Eye tracking and Neuroimaging

Presentation

There is much information that can be gained about the developing brain both by methods that directly assess brain activity during stimulus observation (for example, fMRI and EEG techniques) but also by methods that indirectly assess brain activity by tracking visual attention (using infrared eye tracking). In this talk, Rivera will give specific examples of ways in which both techniques have been used in both typically and atypically developing populations to shed light on differences in the way the external world is being perceived and processed by the human brain. Examples will come from studies that her team has conducted in both autism and the fragile X spectrum of involvement. Future directions and potential avenues for intervention will also be discussed.

About the Speaker

Susan Rivera, Ph.D. is Professor of Psychology and Dean of the College of Behavioral and Social Sciences at the University of Maryland. Prior to this role, she was Professor and Chair of the Psychology department at the University of California, Davis, and a faculty member of the UC Davis MIND Institute and the Center for Mind and Brain. Rivera is the editor in chief of the Journal Human Development and is a current member of the Interagency Autism Coordinating Committee (IACC) under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Her research investigates the interplay between genes, brain function and structure, and environment across the lifespan (from infancy to old age). Using brain imaging (fEEG/fERP and functional and structural MRI) and eye tracking techniques, she investigates research questions about how underlying brain activity and behavior support the development of skills (e.g., attention, visual perception, face processing, sensory processing and emotion regulation) necessary for adaptive cognitive and social-emotional well-being.

Discussing Defund Fear/We Keep Us Safe

2022-2023 Campus Community Book Project

The Interprofessional Book Club returns to UC Davis Health beginning Dec. 2. The 2022-2023 Campus Community Book Project focuses on the topic of transformative justice and public reform and features *Defund Fear: Safety Without Policing, Prisons, and Punishment* by Zach Nunn. Originally titled *We Keep Us Safe: Building Secure, Just, and Inclusive Communities*, the book calls upon many systems that play a role in the imperative for community safety, including the criminal legal system, health care, education, food and housing access, as well as support for caregivers.

Jean Murray-Garcia, associate professor, leads this year's Interprofessional Book Club at UC Davis Health. "Nunn lays out a radical way to shift the conversation about public safety away from fear and punishment and toward growth and support systems for our families and communities," she said. "The author calls for a dismantling of the Us vs. Them mentality and replaces it with a care-based approach."



Grand Rounds Reproductive Justice

February 22

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology presents Dr. Diana Greene Foster from the University of California San Francisco (UCSF).

Dr. Foster will discuss:

- The impact of *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* to patients and abortion care services.
- Challenges related to abortion access in California compared to other states.
- Review of *Turnaway Study* results.

About the speaker
 Diana Greene Foster, Ph.D., is a professor and demographer who uses quantitative models and analyses to evaluate the effectiveness of family planning policies, and the effect of unintended pregnancy on women's lives.

She led the *Turnaway Study*, a nationwide longitudinal prospective study of the health and well-being of women who seek abortion including both women who do and do not receive the abortion.

Dr. Foster's work has demonstrated the effectiveness of the Family PACT program in reducing the incidence of unintended pregnancy and the effect of dispensing a one-year supply of contraception.
