Perspectives on recent Women-Led Uprising in Iran from a panel of students and faculty at UCD.

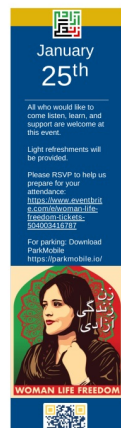

UC Davis Professor Emeritus Mike Henderson's first solo US museum exhibition in 20 years brings to light the pioneering artist's rarely seen contributions to the history of contemporary painting and filmmaking, racial Black politics, and to the story of California art. The exhibition integrates paintings and films by Henderson that offer new views about Black life in the visual languages of protest, Afro-futurism and surrealism. These works depict scenes of anti-Black violence as well as utopian visions and questions of self-making.

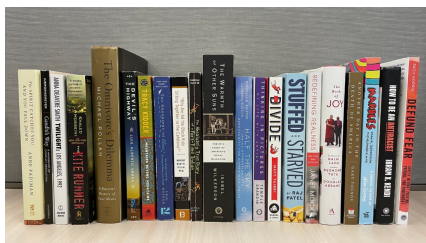

Early Brain-Based Markers of Vulnerability and Resilience to Autism



Presentation
Autism is diagnosed based on behaviors that typically emerge in the second year of life or later. However, the biological mechanisms underlying autism begin much sooner. Indeed, most genes implicated in autism are expressed prenatally, primarily involving basic neuronal processes that ultimately affect the development of neural networks. In this talk, Dapretto will present her findings in infants at elevated likelihood of developing autism that begin to bridge the gap in our knowledge of how alterations in very early brain development eventually cascade into the complex social-communicative characteristics of autism. This work supports a conceptual framework whereby the social impairments that characterize the Autism phenotype may result from earlier sensorimotor atypicalities that disrupt early attentional issues toward social stimuli, resulting in altered experiences and neural development and the emergence of overt autism symptomatology. Dapretto will argue that neuroimaging studies in young infants at high likelihood of developing autism may ultimately pave the way for earlier, more effective interventions.

Discussing *Defund Fear/We Keep Us Safe*

2022-2023 Campus Community Book Project

The Interprofessional Book Club returns to UC Davis Health beginning Dec. 2. The 2022-2023 Campus Community Book Project focuses on the topic of transformative justice and public reform and features *Defund Fear: Safety Without Policing, Prisons, and Punishment* by Zach Nunn. Originally titled *We Keep Us Safe: Building Secure, Just, and Inclusive Communities*, the book calls upon many systems that play a role in the imperative for community safety, including the criminal legal system, health care, education, food and housing access, as well as support for caregivers.

Jean Murray Garcia, associate professor, leads this year's Interprofessional Book Club at UC Davis Health. "There is no one-size-fits-all way to shift the conversation about public safety away from fear and punishment and toward growth and support systems for our families and communities," she said. "The author calls for a dismantling of the Us vs. Them mentality and replaces it with a care-based approach."

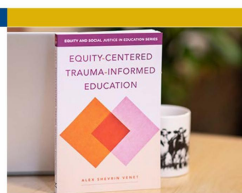

Reproductive Justice**

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology presents Dr. Diana Greene Foster from the University of California San Francisco (UCSF).

Dr. Foster will discuss:

- The impact of *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health* Organization to patients and abortion care services.
- Challenges related to abortion access in California compared to other states.
- Review of *Turnaway Study* results.

About the speaker:

Diana Greene Foster, Ph.D., is a professor and demographer who uses quantitative models and analyses to evaluate the effectiveness of family planning policies and the effect of unwanted pregnancy on women's lives.

She led the Turnaway Study, a nationwide longitudinal prospective study of the health and well-being of women who seek abortion including both women who do and do not receive the abortion.

Dr. Foster's work has demonstrated the effectiveness of the Family PACT program in reducing the incidence of unintended pregnancy and the effect of dispensing a one year supply of contraception.

condition that puts them at risk for SCA****#1 cause of death of student athletes****#1 cause of death on school campuses**We are hosting a Free Youth Heart Screening for the
Sacramento community at Christian Brothers High
School on Sunday, March 12, 2023. The screening is
open to anyone **12-25 years of age at NO COST** and
registration is open now.These screenings are so important! Regular check-ups
and sports physicals miss about 85-90% of the issues
that can cause SCA in children and young adults. Most
conditions must be seen on an electrocardiogram
(EKG) because they are structural or electrical issues
that cannot be heard through a stethoscope. This is a
simple test that records the electrical activity of the
heart using small sticky electrode patches that are
attached to the skin of the chest. EKG testing is quick
and painless.The screening includes cardio risk assessment, EKG,
and doctor review, which takes about 40 minutes to

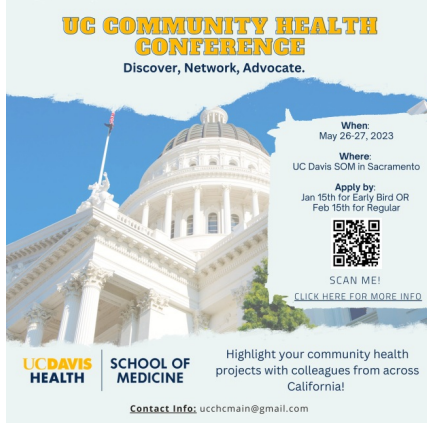
