Application Pathway

1. Fall application timeline open to Internal UC Davis graduate students

- Currently enrolled in a UC Davis graduate program at time of application submission
- Will matriculate with degree prior to DI start date

2. Spring application timeline

- Will occur if there are any unfilled positions after the fall timeline
- Open to ALL prospective candidates





Application Information

- UC Davis Health Dietetic Internship Program utilizes the on-line centralized internship application, Dietetic Inclusive Centralized Application Service (DICAS) (https://dicas.liaisoncas.com/)
- The following documents to be submitted in DICAS prior to the submission deadline:
 - ✓ Personal Statement
 - ✓ UCDH DI Addendum Essay Questions (2)
 - √ 3 Letters of Recommendation
 - ✓ DPD Verification Statement/Declaration of Intent
 - ✓ DPD Required Class List
 - √ CV/Resume
 - ✓ Original Transcripts are to be sent to DICAS
- The UCDMC Application Payment must be received prior to the deadline
- Refer to our application checklist on the website to ensure all items are submitted prior to the deadlines

 - Applications due October 1st
 - Notification November 1st and Decision Day November 15th
- Spring selection timeline
 - DICAS portal opens November 5th

 - Notification March 1st and Decision Day March 15th

Financial Information: Expenses

- **DICAS Fees:** \$50 for the first application and \$25 for each additional application
- UCDH DI Program:
 - Application Fee: \$50 (non-refundable)
 - Administration Fees: \$5000
- Required to have reliable transportation to get to off-site rotations/events
- Medical center does not provide personal health insurance for medical, dental, or vision
- Student membership in Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics (AND) and the Northern Area District required

Selection Criteria

- Application Information Selection Criteria are considered and listed in order of importance:
 - 1) Academics
 - 2) Essay Questions
 - 3) Letters of Recommendation
 - 4) Work and Volunteer Experience
 - 5) Extracurricular Activities
 - 6) Interviews scheduled with top candidates



1. Academics

- Minimum DPD GPA 3.0
- Demonstrate good performance in upper division nutrition and science courses:
 - Advanced nutrition, medical nutrition therapy, nutrition and the lifecycle
 - Biochemistry, anatomy and physiology
- Completion of Master's Degree prior to program start date
- Recency: Completion of DPD academic coursework or graduate degree in nutrition within 3 years of start date



2. Essay Questions

DICAS Personal Statement

- Address all components of the questions
- Include specific examples
- 1000 words or less

UCDH Addendum Questions

- Upload to DICAS
- 2 questions, 300 words or less

Highlight your skills and suitability for the program

- Handling situation with minimal direction
- Working with diverse groups
- Opportunity to market yourself!



3. Letters of Recommendation

Three letters of recommendation (via DICAS)

Requirement

One letter from academic reference: professor or academic advisor

One letter from work or volunteer supervisor

Third letter can be either supervisor OR academic reference



4. Work and Volunteer Experience

- Nutrition or foodservice-related experience is a plus
 - Exposure to a hospital setting is beneficial
- For non-nutrition related experiences, think about transferable skills
- Paid or unpaid internships, or practicum class-based experiences
- Involvement in student nutrition associations/clubs
- Responsibility, time management, problem solving, ability to work with others, leadership



5. Extracurricular Activities

Demonstrate your individual strengths

- Leadership
- Teamwork, collaboration with others
- Time management skills
- Problem solving skills



6. Interviews

- Video-based interview with top candidates
 - WebEx or Zoom
 - 25 minutes
- Scheduled in late October (fall acceptance) and February (spring acceptance)
- Professional, effective communication, ability to verbalize critical thinking and problemsolving skills

- Inpatient: Adults to Geriatrics
- Apply the Nutrition Care Process
 - Nutrition Focused Physical Exam
 - Malnutrition Diagnosing
- Document in Electronic Medical Record (EMR)
- Multidisciplinary care
- Additional opportunities
 - Observe feeding tube placement
 - Observe swallow evaluation
 - Observe surgery

Ambulatory Nutrition

- 4 weeks planned, up to 10 if chosen as elective
- Adults and pediatrics
- Nutrition counseling and education
- Tailoring nutrition therapy for:
 - Learning needs
 - Health literacy
 - Readiness to change
 - Diverse regional community

Community Nutrition

- 2-5 weeks
 - 2 weeks at WIC (Women, Infant, Children)
 - 3-week elective option at DaVita Dialysis
- Nutrition education individual and group
- Develop education materials and lesson plans





Other Learning Activities

- Staff Relief: Minimum of 2 Weeks
- Gain independence
 - Reinforce entry-level practice
- Electives: 6 weeks
- Didactic Classes
 - 10% of internship program hours
- Clinical case study
 - Written and oral presentation on a patient focusing on the nutrition related care and literature related to their care.
- Journal club
 - Intern critical evaluation of nutrition-related research and how applies to clinical practice with facilitated discussion led by the intern
- Clinical Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) Project

2026-2027 Internship Class

- Class Size: 6 interns
- Program Start and Length: September 14, 2026 to July 1, 2027 (42 weeks)
- Arrival to Sacramento 3 weeks before start date: August 24, 2026
- Full-time, 40+ hours per week*
- Daily schedule varies by preceptor/rotation*
- Additional time required outside of workday*
- Interns cover ~7-12 weekend/holiday shifts
- 2-week Winter Break and 1-week Spring Break
- +Some UC holidays

*For these reasons it is strongly encouraged that you avoid outside employment while participating in internship
