- UCD Physician Assistant students spend a minimum of 1,530 hours in supervised clinical rotations in the following areas: Primary Care, Pediatrics, Women's Health, Mental Health, Emergency Medicine, Inpatient, and Surgery. In addition students spend 480 hours practicing clinical skills through workshops, standardized patient encounters, and simulation experiences.
- UCD Nurse Practitioner students spend a minimum of 540 hours in supervised clinical rotations in primary care, and an additional 180 hours in supervised clinical rotations in other areas such as Pediatrics, Women's Health, Mental Health, Emergency Medicine, Inpatient, and Surgery. In addition students spend 390 hours practicing clinical skills through workshops, standardized patient encounters, and simulation experiences.
