# Introduction and Background

- In 2019, American Nurses Association began the End Nurse Abuse campaign (ANA, 2020)
  - -1 in 4 nurses are assaulted in the workplace
  - Only 20% 60% of workplace violence (WPV) are reported
  - Professional Issues Brief suggested that nursing schools should also teach nursing students to identify and manage WPV situations

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## Literature Review

10 studies examined WPV prevention training in nursing programs globally

- No studies on limit setting, de-escalation, or workplace violence identification in nursing programs
- Theory and Practice

# **Roleplay Activity**

- •Synchronous online Zoom session with 46 students and 8 facilitators
- •Breakout groups with 4-6 students and 1 facilitator
  - •6 scenarios to complete
  - •Facilitator is patient while Student is nurse
  - Debrief conducted after each scenario



### Results

#### **Education Module**

- Applicable to a variety of clinical settings
- Include more examples on structure of a good limit setting statement

## **Roleplay Activity**

- Increase time
- Loss of body language made scenarios awkward or difficult

- Interest in the WPV from students and healthcare workers
- Increases student's awareness and confidence in dealing with WPV incidents
