

Adaptive Equipment for SCI

Below you will find images of different types of adaptive equipment often used in individuals with SCI. There are many different types and brands of equipment. Consult your occupational therapist to determine which items are most appropriate for your needs before purchasing. Custom items require an assessment with your therapist, Assistive Technology Professional (ATP), and may be covered by your insurance depending on your plan. Custom items typically tend to last longer; however, they are more costly, and are not always covered by your insurance. It can take up to 3 months to get your custom equipment. Non custom items are readily available for self-purchase, are not covered by insurance, but tend to be more affordable. However, non-custom items may need to be replaced more frequently.

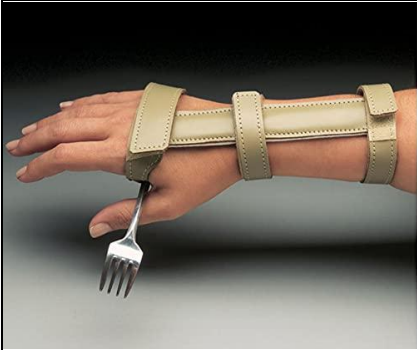
