GPA Calculator Instructions

AMCAS is the American Medical College Application Service, a centralized application service which is used by applicants to allopathic medical schools. AMCAS calculates three GPAs from an applicant's transcript: an overall cumulative GPA, "all other" GPA, and a Science GPA (known as **BCPM**) including all **B**iology, **C**hemistry, **P**hysics, and **M**ath courses.

The AMCAS requires input of every grade from all courses taken during your undergraduate career including withdrawals, repeats, failures, and incompletes. If you had grades removed from your transcript due to extenuating circumstances, you are required to input those too.

Note: Every class you have taken is calculated into your premed GPA. Even if you have had classes expunged from your transcript, they need to be entered in your medical school application.

How to Calculate AMCAS GPA

- 1. Obtain all your official college transcripts, including transcripts for college course you took while in high school.
- 2. Enter your grades for each class into the GPA calculator spreadsheet.
- 3. Mark the classes that count toward BCMP (Science GPA).
- 4. Included classes marked as "withdrawn" on your official transcript. These classes will receive no credit hours towards your BCPM, "0" units.
- 5. Include all courses you took for Pass/No Pass credit ("P"/"NP"). These classes will receive no credit hours towards your BCPM, "0" units.

*The GPA on your official transcripts may differ from the AMCAS GPA. If you would like to confirm your estimated GPA, please use the GPA Calculator linked HERE
