She does inpatient clinical work in both departments, spending time on the General Medicine, inpatient Psychiatry, combined Medicine-Psychiatry, Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry, and Emergency Psychiatry services. Additionally, Dr. Gagliardi is director of both the General Psychiatry and the combined Internal Medicine / Psychiatry programs at Duke.
