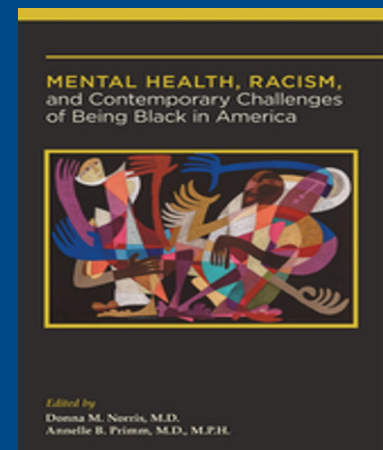

Mental Health, Racism, and Contemporary Challenges of Being Black in America, offers a historical and present-day account of the complexities of living and thriving within Black communities. The book tells a story of a people who have utilized creativity to surmount tremendous obstacles such as discrimination and exclusion to build a more positive future for their families. Among the chapter authors are Solomon Carter Fuller awardees and other psychiatrists who were inspired by their achievements in the face of significant odds. Their perspectives address the chronological and transgenerational lived experience including trauma of Black people in the United States and their impact on mental health and well-being. Since 1969, the Solomon Carter Fuller Award is given annually by the American Psychiatric Association to a Black psychiatrist who has pioneered in an area that has significantly improved the quality of life for African American people.
