Study description: The purpose of this study evaluates trends in the perioperative outcomes of colorectal surgery patients at UC Davis from 2013 to 2023. Some of the variables we plan on studying are length of stay, complications, and 30-day postoperative status. The goal is to eventually create a comprehensive so we can identify areas of improvement. Potential benefits of this study include a more efficient surgical workflow and improved patient care. We also hope that analyzing these patterns will help future researchers answer questions related to colorectal surgery. Furthermore, the Colorectal Division at UC Davis is rapidly expanding. With an increase in surgeons and patients, this study will help identify areas of improvement and lead to a shorter length of stay and decreased perioperative complications.

Study description: This project is focused on determining how COVID-19 has impacted Plastic Surgery Consult notes. The predicted outcome of this study is that plastic surgery consultations decreased over the pandemic. By understanding if this outcome is true, we can utilize this finding to better understand causal factors. This study aims to understand how the pandemic affected the rate of plastic research consultations, and with this data we can further identify causal factors. By further understanding patient perspectives, plastic surgery consultations could be adapted to occur with shelter-in-place restrictions. If specific causal factors are identified, we can pinpoint methods to improve consultations.

WELCOME TO OUR NEW PROGRAM CO-DIRECTOR



How long have you been in RESURG and what are some highlights from your experience in the program?


