#### **Kids Ski Free**

Steamboat's Kids Ski Free program enables children 12 years of age and under to ski free the same number of days as their parents when parents or grandparents purchase a 5-or-more-day lift ticket. 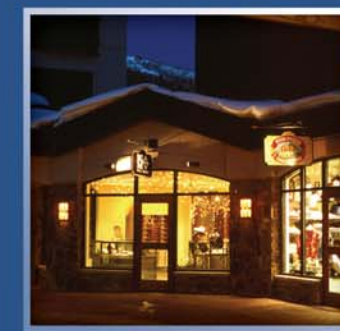
